

## **MISSION TO THE POOR**

Reverend and dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters, prayerful greetings to you in the Holy Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### 1. Lesson from St. Teresa of Calcutta

God loved the world and sent his Son into the world that the world might be saved through Him (cf. Jn 3: 16-17). St. Paul expresses the universal salvific will of God thus: "God ....desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Tim 2:4). Jesus, by his passion, death and resurrection, has brought salvation to the world.

Jesus has commissioned the Apostles to proclaim the Gospel to all: "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to the whole creation" (Mk 16:15). The Pilgrim Church is missionary by her

very nature (A.G. 2). The Church exists in order to evangelize. Evangelization is the vocation proper to the Church (cf. E.N. 14). The Church continues the saving mission of Christ through the proclamation of the Gospel, through the celebration of the sacraments and through various services.

Jesus associated himself in a special way with the poor, the marginalized, the sick and the sinners. He healed every disease and infirmity (Mt 9:35). Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand and touched a leper and cured him (Mk 1:40-42). He forgave the sins of sinners (cf. Lk 7: 47-50). He loved the unloved; he valued the un-wanted; he cared for the un-cared. He welcomed the un-welcomed; he gave importance to the little ones; he searched for the lost ones.

Following the example of Christ, the Church, in her mission, ministries and services should pay special attention to the poor, the neglected, the marginalized, the un-wanted, the un-loved and the un-cared for. The Church should always "remember the poor" (Gal 2:10).

Love for Jesus, love for the souls and love for the mission brought Sr. Teresa to India. Mother Teresa, as a Loretto nun, was quite exemplary in her life of prayer and commitment to duties.  $10^{th}$  September 1946 will always remain **the Day of days** in the life of Mother Teresa. On that day she had a great inspiration. The words of Jesus, hanging on the Cross, "I thirst" touched her heart deeply. She felt that these words were addressed to her personally. She felt that Jesus was calling her for a **new way of being** and a **new way of doing.** She clearly understood that Jesus is thirsting for Love, for souls, for human persons. In the light of faith and with the strength of prayer, she decided to devote herself entirely to quench the thirst of Jesus by loving and serving the poorest of the poor. Love for Jesus, love for the souls and love for the poor brought

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Mother Teresa visited the poor families, washed the sores of the Children, cared for the old men lying sick on the road and nursed women dying of hunger and disease. She was fully convinced that the biggest disease was not leprosy or tuberculosis but rather the feeling of being unwanted, unloved, uncared for, deserted by everybody. With the eyes of Christ she looked at the poor; with heart of Christ she loved the unloved; with the hands of Christ she embraced the unwanted. Clad in a simple white sari with a blue border, with a rosary in her hand, Mother Teresa, loving and serving the poorest of the poor in the slums of Calcutta, became the **living Gospel**. She became the living image of the Loving Christ.

It is the love of Christ that pushed (2 Cor 5:14) Mother Teresa into the slums of Calcutta, into the homes of the poor. The Eucharist remained the Centre of her life and service. Daily Mass. Holy Communion and prolonged prayer at the feet of the Eucharistic Lord gave her the necessary inspiration and energy. courage and perseverance for her daily life and services. The life of Mother Teresa was a constant moving from the Lord to the poor and from the poor to the Lord. She carried the Lord Jesus to the hearts of the poor and she brought the poor to the feet of Christ. This is the mission of the Church.

Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity devote themselves to the works of mercy (cf. Mt 25: 31-40). The Holy Father's intention to have the canonization of Mother Teresa during the **Jubilee Year of Mercy** is very fitting. St. Teresa of Calcutta, with her shining example and powerful message, remains the "Carrier of God's Tender and Merciful Love".

The Church in India should pay special attention to the poor and the marginalized. Christ came into to the world "to preach the Good News to the poor" (Lk 4: 18). The poor are blessed:

"Blessed are you poor, for yours is the kingdom of God" (Lk 6:20). The mission of the Church towards the poor is fulfilled by the proclamation of the Gospel. The Gospel is to be proclaimed both by word and deed, by solidarity with the poor and services to the poor.

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Poverty in India is one of the most serious challenges which the Church in India has to face. Poverty as a social misery is to be eradicated or at least to be notably reduced. In India there is enough for the need of everyone but not for the greed of any one. It is a fact that the poor in India are neglected and are exploited. The poor remain poor and they become even poorer.

The spiritual needs and the material needs of the poor should be taken care of by us. We should be generous to share with the poor and the needy our material resources. It is high time that we seriously look into our costly constructions and expensive celebrations. By our simple life-style and by introducing moderations in our constructions and celebrations, we should be able to spare enough of money for the education of the poor children, for the marriages of poor women, for building houses for the poor etc. Let us keep in mind that taking care of the needs of the poor is one of the proper objectives of the temporal goods of the Church (cf. Can. 1254.2).

Charities to the poor are not enough; development works for the poor are not enough; the poor need to be empowered. Education and employment are sure means of empowering the poor and the marginalized. What we do for the poor is important. But **the way** we do for the poor is more important. And **who** we are to the poor is the most important thing.

Following the example of Christ and taking inspiration from the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta, let us love and serve the poor with joy and dedication. May Mary our Mother, help us to be sensitive to the 'needs of the poor and the marginalized'.

### 2. Rev. Fr. T. S. Rajarathinam (1933-2016)

Rev. Fr. T.S. Rajarathinam was God's precious gift to our Archdiocese. "Come follow me" (Mt 9:9). He followed the Lord 83 years as a Christian and 56 years as a priest. He was a man of great faith and fervent prayer; he had great devotion to our Lord and to our Lady. He is known for great zeal for souls and hard work. He built churches in many substations. He promoted vocation to the priesthood and religious life. He was available for pastoral ministry in any parish. He was always approachable. He was a great pastor of souls. Let us thank God for the precious gift of Fr. T.S. Rajarathinam and pray in a special way for the repose of his soul.

#### FROM THE DESK OF VICARS

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#### 01. Family Rosary

God provides a golden opportunity to receive and restore the family rosary during this month of October by the Pastors, Basic Christian Communities, Legion of Mary etc. to awaken our people towards the genuine devotion of our Blessed Mother in the evenings at homes.

#### 02. Marching Towards Synod

As many heads so many opinions about the forthcoming Archdiocesan Synod in the near future. The more we prepare the more we will profit by the celebration of the Synod. Preparations before the Synod, Participations during the Synod and implementation after the Synod will be over common concern of the Local Church.

**Preparations before the Synod:** Remote preparation, proximate preparation and immediate preparation will keep all of us to get involved in the Synod.

We have nothing to achieve but to become aware at three levels, human awareness of God's presence, Christ awareness of Christ's presence and consecrated awareness of the Holy Spirit in all of us, which we call awakening, enlightment and growth of integral consciousness of the Triune God in all.

The awareness of the autonomous Local Church will emerge among us to be of one mind and heart in the mystical body of Christ to be united with the universal church and the Risen God.

We could go through the Canon Law in the code, share the experiences of Synods that have taken place in different dioceses of Tamil Nadu region, study the present situation of the Local Church of Pondicherry - Cuddalore, which will be the basis for future reflection, dialogue and discernment for growing deep in faith and commitment.

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### **VOICE FROM METROPOLITAN MATRIMONIAL TRIBUNAL - 72**

#### Family: School for life and not just for a living

When we speak of responsible parenthood in the context of marriage and family, this special point to be focused as modern parents look for their children's perfection in everything: The parents cannot leave the task of educating their children to the school and tuition centre; on the contrary they have the crucial and most important role in the primary as well as ongoing education of their children and their education is not for a living but for life.

Dr.APJ Adbul Kalam, the former president of India, often used to tell the students, "Dreaming small is a crime." Visionaries have big dreams which are broad, lasting and inclusive whereas ambitious people are self-centred and busy with copying others and competing with others. Visionaries always think of making a significant contribution to the society and thereby leave a legacy. Parents have a critical role in instilling big dreams in their children and transforming them into visionaries.

Building the character of a child cannot be left to the value education classes conducted in the school, although value education is an essential goal of education. Values are caught by the children by observing the members of the family, especially parents. If a child observes every time he/she accompanies his/her father to the railway station that he stands in the queue and purchases platform ticket that child will not indulge in corrupt practices. A child who observes his parents paying tax when they purchase goods will learn how to become a responsible citizen. A child who sees his father respecting his wife will learn how to respect women. A child who hears his parents always speaking positively about others will not indulge in gossiping and character assassination. A child who notices his parents helping people in need will become sensitive and compassionate to others. A child who accompanies his parents to the church, Holy Mass and sacraments, will become also a spiritual

person. Character building makes a person spiritual and sensitive to the needs of the neighbors.

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The present education is not preparing the students to face difficulties and withstand cries. When the children notice how their parents face cries with courage and determination, they also will be inspired to face such situations with equanimity. Motivating children to read inspiring books, especially the biographies of persons who have come up in life through struggles like Abraham Lincoln, Dr.APJ Adbul Kalam, Mary Kom, Milkha Singh, life of saints, Holy Bible, etc. is an effective means to enhance the strength of mind and heart. Parents may adopt the practice of gifting books to their children on birthdays and other occasions and encourage them to read as many books as possible.

Scoring 90 to 99 per cent mark in the examinations need not be the expression of outstanding intellect. An intelligent person is one who is able to differentiate between right and wrong and make right choices in life. He neither goes after the crowed nor cowed down by the crowed. He/she stands firm on the ground of his/her deep convictions. When children see that their parents make the right choices based on ethical and moral principles they also learn how to make the right choices.

Today parents are worried about making the future of their children safe and comfortable and they slog day and night to generate the needed resources. In their struggle for amassing resources they forget to provide children what they need most: care, love and quality time. Educational institutions have a great responsibility to make the parents aware of their role in the holistic education of their children which nobody else can perform, as their role can neither be delegated nor outsourced. Most of the marriages of this type are failure after certain years by experience. Neither of them lives in their own religion and become Godless people. #### **Visits**

I thank the Vicar Forane and the Parish Priests of Karaikal Vicariate who received me well and dedicated some time to discuss about their Pastoral Ministry and the problems they encounter in their Parish work. A parish is a community of believers who should be formed into a community of disciples of our Lord. And it comprises of Small/Basic Ecclesial Communities (SCC/BCC/BEC). And with this as vision we may have to conceive our parish pastoral plan for a year or for certain period of time.

On behalf of the Catechetical Commission of our diocese, I attended the three days meeting of the National Catechetical Conference held in Bhopal from 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> of September. On the theme **"Formation of Catechists in India"**. This was organized by the CCBI Commission for Catechetics. Eminent speakers in this field have

dealt the various aspects of the Catechists and Catechetics in India. After all the presentations on Vocation and the Role of Catechists, qualities and spirituality of Catechists, habits, formation and problems of the Catechists, the conference addressed the Church of India that all the baptized Christians by the very nature of their calling should be basically Catechists wherever they are and in whatever they do. All the more for us, the Parish Priests, we are called to be the model catechists in our parishes.

#### 1. Regional Secretary visit

Rev. Fr. Albert Nelson the Regional Secretary visited Our Archdiocesan Sc/St Commission Office at Anaiyeri on 17th September. He discussed about commission activities in our Diocese.

#### **Hot vs Cold**

#### Which Water Temperature is Best for Your Skin

Washing your face: Before you apply a cleansing agent on your face, use warm water to wet the face as it helps to open up your pores. After the cleansing agent is applied, then use cold water to wash your face. Cold water helps in closing the pores after the impurities are removed from the skin Shaving: If you are going to shave, then opt for warm water as it opens the pores up and thus makes it easier for the blade to glide through the skin. This also reduces the risk of razor burns on your skin.

Washing your feet: Wash your feet with lukewarm water as it facilitates dead cell removal and also helps in getting rid of warts.
