



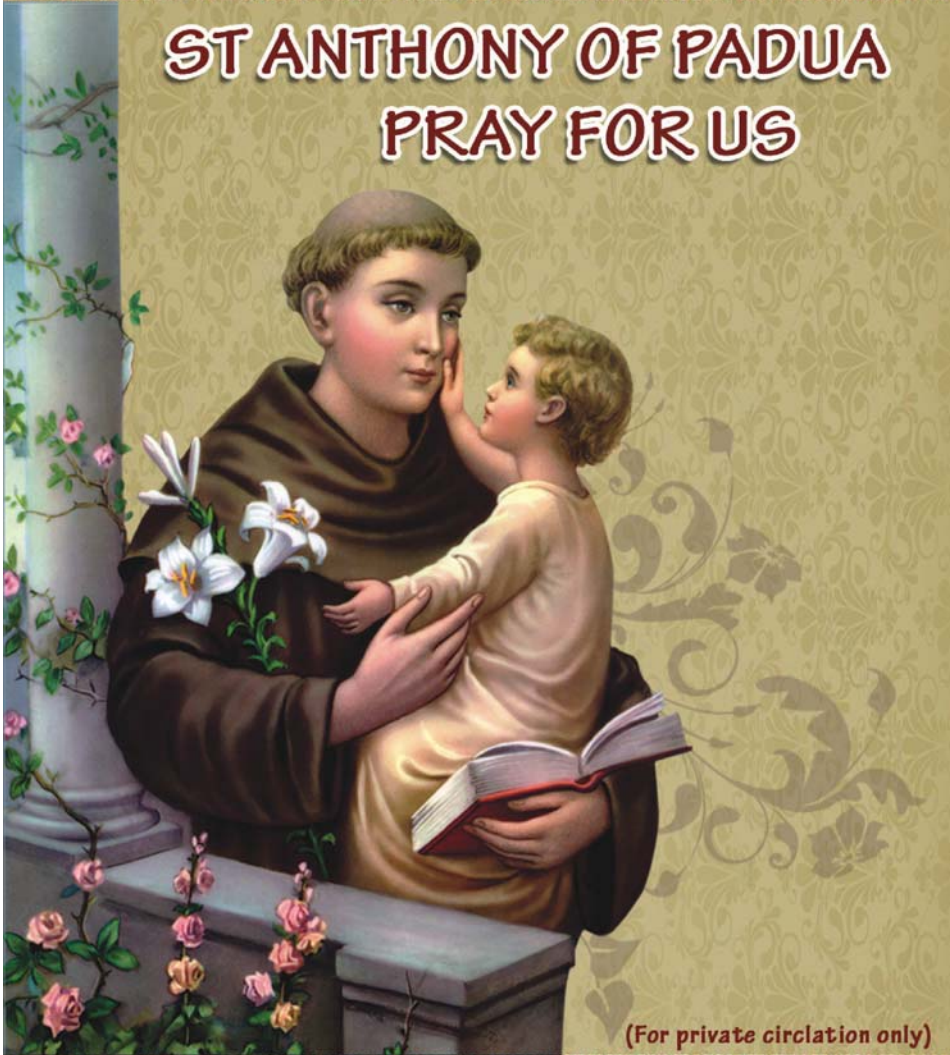

Archbishop's Message



St. Anthony on the Homily

01. The Homily

“Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation” (Mk. 16:15). This is the command given by the Risen Lord to the Apostles. On the day of Pentecost, the Apostles were filled by the power of the Holy Spirit and they began to proclaim the gospel. (Acts. 2:1-13). Proclamation of the Gospel is the vocation proper to the church. The church exists in order to evangelize. (cf. En. 14)

“Feed my lambs”, “tend my sheep” (Jn. 21: 15-17) is the specific command given by the Lord to St. Peter, the Head of the Apostolic College. “Take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you Guardians” (Acts

20:28) is the admonition given by St. Paul to the elders of the church.

The Bishops and the Priests are called to feed themselves and the flock of Christ by the **Word of God** contained in the **Holy Scriptures** and in the Most **Holy Eucharist**. “The Parish Priest has the obligation of ensuring that the word of the God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish. He is therefore to see to it that the lay members of Christ’s faithful are instructed in the truths of faith, especially by means of the **homily** on Sundays and holydays of obligation and by **catechetical formation**” (can. 528:1)

Prayer, proclamation of the word of God, celebration of the sacraments are the important duties and functions of the Parish Priests. “The most important form of preaching is the **homily**, which is part of the liturgy and is reserved to a priest or deacon. In the course of the liturgical year, the mysteries of the faith and the rules of Christian living are to be expounded in the homily **from the sacred text**” (can. 767)

St. Anthony of Padua is a model and guide for us in our ministry of the word of God; especially in the art of preaching the homily. He compares the homily to a **chariot** and the **four wheels** of the chariot are the four readings of the liturgy on Sundays and Holydays of obligation:-

1. The gospels reading
2. The reading from the old testaments
3. The introductory versicle
4. The reading from the Epistles

The words of God are “Words of eternal life” (Jn. 6:68). The word of God is a Light to our path and a lamp to our feet (cf. Ps. 118:105). Preaching the homily is an art. It is to be learnt. The words of God need to be communicated to people in a fruitful manner. The homily is to be preached not only efficiently but also effectively. The word of God should accomplish in men that which God purposes (cf. Is. 55:11).

St. Anthony of Pauda is both an effective and efficient preacher of the word of God. He proposes the following steps for an effective and efficient way of proclaiming the homily.

- A.**
- i. **Reading** the words of God attentively.
 - ii. **Reflecting** over the readings deeply.
 - iii. **Understanding** the **words** and the **meaning** of the reading with the help of Commentaries.
 - iv. Paying special attention to the **texts** in their **contexts**.
 - v. **Praying** over the words of God and invoking the special assistance of the Holy Spirit, who is the real agent of the proclamation of the word of God.
 - vi. **Preparing** the homily by focusing on the **message** to be given to the community in its concrete life-situations.
 - vii. **Preparing the homily** by carefully selecting the most suitable words, phrases and examples to convey the message.
 - viii. **Intense Prayer** is the best immediate preparation.

ix. **Preaching** the homily clearly, slowly, audibly and with conviction.

B. Holiness of life is the best way of preaching the homily effectively. “Modern man listens more willingly to **witnesses** than to teachers; and if he listens to teachers, it is because they are witnesses at the same time” (E.N.41)

- + St. Antony of Pauda **read** the word of God
- + He **believed** in the word of God
- + He **practised** the word of God
- + He **preached** the word of God

Hence, his homily was always effective. The best way to preach the gospel is to live the gospel.

C. St. Anthony of Padua places the homily in the history of salvation and in the mystery of Christ. He encourages a great devotion to the person of Christ, Christ present in the Eucharist. He promotes a tender and filial devotion to Mary. He exhorts the faithful to lead a truly Christian life according to the teaching of Christ.

He encourages the people to practice virtues such as faith, hope, humility, poverty, chastity, love of God and of the neighbours. He says **humility** is the mother and root of all virtues. He denounces strongly the following vices; pride, avarice and debauchery.

St. Anthony of Padua is a Saint of **Prayer**, of the **Word of God**, of the most Holy **Eucharist**. He is eminently a **Marian saint**. His life is a powerful witness of sanctity. He is a constant intercessor for the people. He is a powerful protector of the people. He is an eminent teacher of divine truths. And he is an excellent preacher of the word of God. His life brought glory to God and good to the people.

To-day people are hungering and thirsting for the word of God. People are eagerly waiting to get the messages of the gospel from us, priests and religious. Following the example of the Apostles, let us entrust to the lay persons services such as serving at the **table** and let us “**devote ourselves to prayer** and to **the ministry of the word**” (Acts 6:4). Following the example and instructions of St. Anthony of Padua, let us prepare well our Sundays homilies and preach them effectively and efficiently. Let us keep in mind that a short homily at weekday masses is strongly recommended (cf. Can. 767.3). Let us preach the gospel in season and out of season (2 Tim. 4:2) both by word and deed, by oral proclamation and by the witness of our holy life.

O St. Anthony of Padua, pray for us and assist us that, following your example, we may live the gospel and preach the gospel effectively.

2. Sterlite

We strongly condemn the atrocities on the anti-sterlite protestors. We condole the death of those persons who were shot dead. We express our prayerful solidarity with the victims

and with the Bishop, the clergy, the religious and the laity of the Diocese of Tuticorin.

3. Accounts

Those Parish Priests and the heads of the educational institutions and estates, who have not yet submitted the accounts, are asked to submit the accounts immediately.

4. Laity Sunday

Sunday 24th June 2018 is celebrated as the Laity Sunday. The theme is: “கூட்டுப் பொறுப்பும் இணைந்த செயல்பாடும் பங்குகளில் மலர்”. Parish Priests are greatly exhorted to celebrate the Laity Sunday in a meaningful manner. Let us affirm our Laity and encourage them to be active participates both in the church and in the society.

intentional communication. Here are some of the tools that can help couples transform their marriage.

1. Acknowledge: When problems arise, acknowledge that you are part of the problem. Take responsibility for your own words, emotions, actions, and reactions. Don't justify them by blaming them on your spouse. "All must test their own work; then that work, rather than their neighbor's work, will become a cause for pride." – Galatians 6:4-5

2. Be open for change: Try to put yourself in your spouse's shoes and be willing to go with his/her perspective and suggestions. A marriage succeeds to the extent that the husband can accept influence from his wife and vice versa. "When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, Do you want to be made well?"-John 5:6

3. Practice Empathy: Empathy is accurately identifying the feelings and experiences of your spouse. You demonstrate empathy when you communicate an understanding of your partner's feeling in a particular situation. Try to understand your spouse's viewpoint. He or she wants to be heard and understood. When you and your spouse meet these needs, the result is more healthy communication patterns, greater intimacy, and a higher level of marital satisfaction. "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" – Romans 12:15.

4. Clear Self-expression: Many assume that their partner knows their needs, feelings, and opinions even though they have never actually been verbalized. If you expect your partner to read your mindset, both of you are up for negative results-hurt, disappointment, misunderstandings. State your thoughts as clearly, honestly, and positively as you can. Don't

avoid talking about something because you are afraid of what your partner will think. Focus on how something is affecting you. Try not to blame or criticize your partner while you are expressing yourself. "But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ." – Ephesians 4:15.

5. Have appropriate Body Language: Good communication is more about body language than actual words. You can shut down your spouse by sending the clear message by your body language that you are not interested, that you are bored, angry, or have to quit listening. Examples: Crossed arms, angry glares, tone of voice, blank stare, rolling eyes, lack of eye contact, turning your back to your spouse. Make sure that your facial expressions, body language, and the tone of your voice reflect what you are saying. As you develop an awareness of the signs and symbols of body language, you can better understand your spouse, and communicate more effectively with him or her. At the same time, your body language reveals your feelings and meanings to your spouse. "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver. Like a gold ring or an ornament of gold is a wise rebuke to a listening ear." – Proverbs 25:11-12.

6. Don't dump your garbage on your spouse: Express negative feelings constructively. There will be time when you feel bitterness, resentment, disappointment or disapproval. These feelings need to be communicated in order for change to occur. But how you express these thoughts is critical. "I am really disappointed that you are working late again tonight," is very different from, "You clearly do not care one whit about me or the kids. If you did, you would not work late every night." "Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil." Eph. 4:26-27.

7. Listen without being defensive: For a marriage to succeed, both spouses must be able to hear each other's complaints without getting defensive. This is much harder than learning how to express negative feelings effectively. "You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness." James 1:19-20.

8. Do not keep bringing up old negative memories: When a couple is consumed with negativity, it not only affects their past but it can put their future in danger. In almost all cases there are very good and happy memories in every relationship, but if the spouses are so negative that they can't remember the good times they had, their relationship is deteriorating. "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old." - Isaiah 43:18

9. Focus on the positive instead of the negative: Freely express positive feelings. Most people are quicker to express negative feelings than positive ones. It is vital to the health of your marriage that you affirm your spouse. Positive feelings such as appreciation, affection, respect, admiration, approval, and warmth expressed to your spouse are like making deposits into your love account. You should have five positive deposits for every one negative. If your compliments exceed your complaints, your spouse will pay attention to your grievances. If your complaints exceed your compliments, your criticism will fall on deaf ears. "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and

if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." – Philippians 4:8.

10. Speak with kindness and gentleness: When something is bothering you, bring it up gently and without blame. Be aware of the tone used when communicating problems. A mutually respectful tone - one that is neither passive nor aggressive - goes a long way in starting a productive dialogue. "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." – Proverbs 15:1

11. Using "I" Messages: Try to own your feelings, by using "I" statements when communicating (e.g., I feel, I need, I want). "I" messages are very different from a "you" message. "You" messages blame and judge the other person on his/her behavior. "You" messages often trigger defensiveness or hostility towards your partner and tend to increase conflict. "The mind of the wise makes their speech judicious, and adds persuasiveness to their lips." – Proverbs 16:23

12. Use humour: Levity can go a long way when used at the right time. If you find yourself stuck in a cycle of negativity, try to lighten things up with some humour or silly behaviour. This can sometimes snap a couple out of an anger trance. Like other strategies, it's important to be thoughtful about how and when to use humour, so that your significant other doesn't feel that his/her concerns are being trivialized. "A cheerful heart is a good medicine, but a downcast spirit dries up the bones." – Proverbs 17:22.

13. Seek first to understand rather than being understood: When in conflict, one wants to be understood. How many times have you heard, "you just don't understand what I'm saying!" Of course, healthy relationships do involve understanding one another, but rather than emphasizing your own desire to be heard, try changing your focus to putting attention on understanding the other. This can

really shift the relational dynamic and pave the way for more open and fresh communication. “In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets.” – Matthew 7:12

14. Be ready to forgive: Let your partner know that you understand his/her point of view by validating it. It may sound obvious, but don't forget to take responsibility for what you've done and apologize in necessary. “Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you.” Ephesians 4:32.

15. Spend quality time together: Spending time together, as quality time, is important to nurture your relationship. So, take interest in what your spouse does, and take the opportunity to spend enjoyable time together. You also need time to discuss issues or problems in your relationship. But this should not be a time for blaming, but for finding common solutions to enhance your relationship. “Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.” Genesis 2:24

16. Pray continually: Take a few moments to listen to God, express your concerns to Him and ask Him to help you reflect His relational ideas in your marriage. “Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart.” –Luke 18:1 (extracts from the Newsletter of Holy Cross Family Ministries, India, written by Fr. Sundar Wilson, ofm. Cap, Vol.12, no.1, March 2018, pp. 5-6). Thanking you.

Youth Commission Report for June -2018

Activities

1. National Youth Commission Conference of CCBI Animators and Chaplains Training Programme (ACT)

The second Animators and Chaplains Training programme (ACT-II) organised by the National Youth Commission under the aegis of Conference of Catholic Bishops of India supported by Indian Catholic Youth Movement and Young Catholic Students/ Young Students’ Movement was held from 18th -26th May 2018 at NBCLC, Bangalore. The twelve days programme included a 2 days’ consultation meeting with the ICYM NEXCOs followed by the training programme, which started on 18th May 2018 with the inaugural mass celebrated by Rev. Fr. Stephen Alathara, Deputy Secretary General, CCBI. During his homily

he explained the importance of the training and power youth contain. The training session began by invoking God's blessings followed by lighting the lamp by the dignitaries. Mr. Percival Holt, President of ICYM welcomed the delegates. Fr. Sagaya John welcomed the participants and gave some important instructions for their stay. Following this Fr. Stephen delivered the key note address in which he said that 'we are not here to participate but to contribute'. We have been moving from confusion to clarity. Today we have reached some clarity but miles to go. He also explained about CCBI and CBCI movements. Post lunch, the training programme began with a session on group dynamics & group building by Mr Prashanth. He conducted many group building activities to demonstrate to the animators and also 'how to attract young people' to youth ministry. The training programme continued for the next eight days. Participants were trained based on 8 modules: Module 1: Principles & Dynamics of Youth ministry Models of youth ministry; skills in conducting youth meetings; methods of conducting youth programmes; event management with youth. Module 3: Youth & Media Media management: potential of social media in youth ministry; media relations and youth ministry. Module 4: Youth & Spirituality Methodology for conducting creative prayer sessions, prayer meetings, Bible study groups, youth I, youth retreats etc. National Youth Commission Conference of Catholic Bishops' of India (CCBI) Module 5: Working with

Youth at Risk Pastoral care of young at risk; specific problems: drugs, addictive behaviours, abuses, deviant behavior, child labour, Human trafficking, Human Rights & Youth. Module 6: Youth and Life Skills Self-awareness; Empathy; Critical thinking; Creative thinking; Decision making; Problem Solving; Effective communication; Interpersonal relationship; Coping with stress; Coping with emotion. Module 7: Youth and Vocational Guidance The Synod on youth; faith and Vocational Discernment; career guidance; knowledge on job opportunities etc. Module 8: Youth Ministry and Social Consciousness Challenging youth for social activism; Civic responsibility; instilling political consciousness. During the training, participants were divided into six groups. All the groups were involved in various activities like conducting prayer meetings, visiting parishes, group dynamics, recreation and animation etc. Every day began with the Eucharistic celebration and concluded with night prayer. Participants evaluated the day's programme every evening and on the last day there was a general evaluation. Every participant was asked to pray for a secret friend and on the last day during the short concluding programme, each participant revealed their friend and gave him/her a gift in a creative manner. All the participants were awarded a participation certificate. Fr. Chetan thanked all and asked the participants for their continued and enriched support to the youth and youth ministry. The programme saw participation of 38 participants. Fr. A. Arputharaj, DYD, Pondicherry and Sr. Sofia FIHM were the participants from Archdiocese of Pondicherry. On 26th May 2018, Fr. Chetan
