



ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE



Fratelli Tutti:

St. Francis of Assisi is known for his life of simplicity, poverty and humility. He had a great love for God and for all human persons. He was close to God and close to the human family. He had respect for God's creations.

Pope Francis, inspired by his patron saint, St. Francis of Assisi, has published his Encyclical Letter, entitled **Fratelli Tutti** on 3rd October 2020. This letter is addressed to all men and women, to all the brothers and sisters, to all the human person on earth. This letter aims at building up **brotherhood** and **fellowship** and at promoting **fraternity** and **friendship** among all the members of the human family.

We have bought 200 copies of this precious encyclical letter. All our Archdiocesan priests will be given a copy each. This book is very inspiring and very useful. A reflective and prayerful reading of this book is very much recommended.

1) From the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the the Sacraments, we have received a directive, dated 13th May 2020, about the prayer we usually say at the end of the Collect at our

Masses in English: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ...**One** God for ever and ever". The word '**One**' at the end of the conclusion in our English translation could give rise to theological ambiguity. Hence, we are asked to drop the word '**One**' at the end of the prayers. This directive is to be followed by all who use the English version of the Roman Missal.

In this news letter (on page 326) is given the Directive of the above mentioned Congregation.

2) Plenary Indulgences:

On 23-10-2020 the **Apostolic Penitentiary** has published a Decree on Plenary Indulgences for the deceased in the current pandemic. This Decree is given in this news letter on page 328.

3) Divine Liturgy:

We have gradually resumed the celebration of the Eucharistic liturgy and other Sacraments on Sundays and on week days. We should always keep in mind the local conditions and strictly follow the directives of the local civil authorities concerning the safety of the people, such as using sanitizer, wearing face mask and keeping social distance. During this pandemic family prayer and the reading of the Word of God are to be greatly encouraged.

4) Council of Cardinals:

We are very happy to know that His Holiness Pope Francis has re-nominated His Eminence Oswald Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay, a member of the Council of Cardinals. He has been also re-nominated to the Pontifical Council for Legislative Texts. We offer

our hearty felicitations to His Eminence Oswald Cardinal Gracias and wish him success in his great responsibilities.

6) Dalit Liberation Sunday:

7) Rev. Fr. A.J.C. Lawrence: 1948 – 2020:

“Come, follow me” (Mt 4.19). Rev. Fr. A.J.C. Lawrence closely followed Jesus, 72 years as a Christian and 44 years as a priest. He spent about 30 years in the formation and education of the youth. He is a great educationist. He was also a great pastor of souls. He was a man of principles. He is known for his sense of discipline and hard work. On 12th October he went to his eternal reward. We thank God for the precious gift of Fr. A.J.C. Lawrence to our Archdiocese and pray for the repose of his soul.

8) Rev. Fr. M. Jayaseelan: 1976 – 2020:

On 26th October 2020, he went to his eternal reward, at a relatively young age of 44. He is known for his life of simplicity and hard work. 

Directive of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments is given below:

Your Excellency,

The Congregation recently received the latest raft of Gray and Green books issued to the Episcopal Conferences by the International Commission on English in the Liturgy. It is satisfying to note the breadth and quality of work which the Commission continues to accomplish on behalf of the member conferences. The members of the Commission, the staff there and all those who collaborate in the important work of translation are to be thanked.

Upon studying the texts which we have received there is, we feel, one matter which should now be addressed with the Episcopal Conferences which previously the Congregation had raised informally with ICEL. Therefore I am writing to the Presidents of each member conference of the Commission. The matter in question concerns the Trinitarian conclusion of the Collect prayers. These prayers can be concluded in one of three manners as laid out in n.54 of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. Currently, in each of these formulas the Latin words “Deus, per omnia saecula saeculorum” are rendered in English as “one God, for ever and ever”.

For some time now the Congregation has been of the view that the addition of “one” is mistaken and problematic. On the one hand, it can serve to undermine the statement of the Son’s unique identity within the Trinity which the Latin formulas so strongly convey and, on the other hand, it can also be interpreted as saying that Jesus Christ is “one God”. Either or both of these interpretations is injurious to the faith of the

Church. This is of particular import in this time when many people see Jesus simply as a good man or moral teacher, akin to Socrates or the Buddha, but they fail to recognise him as the incarnate Son of God and Second Person of the Trinity.

It is clear from the Latin texts that the doxology emphasises the divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son, who intercedes on our behalf, as the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, to the Father and which prayer is made in the unity of the Holy Spirit. Thus the Son’s role of priestly mediation is made clear. To transfer the Trinitarian relational element *in unitate* as meaning *unus Deus* is incorrect. It is no accident, as evidence shows, that this doxological phrase was coined in Africa as a means to combat the Arian heresy. Then, as *Ordo Romanus V* shows, the addition of *Deus* as follows “Per Dominum nostrum Iesum Christum Filium tuum. Qui tecum vivit et regnat Deus ...”, further serves to underline the Son’s divinity.

Indeed, in this instance, the English translation of these conclusions is an outlier which is not mirrored in any of the other main language translations. French and German simply use *Dieu* and *Gott* respectively; Italian uses *che e Dio, Egli e Dio* and *Tu sei Dio*; Spanish uses *yes Dios* and *eres Dios*, while Portuguese uses *que e Deus* and *Vas que sois Deus*.

Matters become even more troubling when we consider that the English translation of the Missal is often used as a guide for other, less diffuse languages around the world which obviously runs the risk of an unauthentic interpretation of the *lex orandi* being repeated. Where this has previously come to our notice, we have corrected

the translation. You will no doubt have noted that in the English versions of the texts for the Mass in Time of Pandemic provided by this Dicastery the word “one” has been dropped. This was not an oversight.


Because in our view the addition of the word “one” corrupts the *lex orandi* and therefore the *lex credendi* we rule that it should no longer be used in the translation of these texts into English. It will be for Episcopal Conferences, through ICEL, to decide how best to translate these formulas in order to safeguard both their Trinitarian shape as well

as their profession of the Son's divinity. You may wish to adopt the French and German approach or to opt for something closer to the Italian, Spanish and Portuguese model.


We are aware that this ruling has implications for the Collects as they are found in the current translation of *The Roman Missal*, but perhaps now, given the ongoing work of preparing a new translation of *The Liturgy of the Hours*, would be an opportune moment to revise the translation of n. 54 of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* to reflect this more mature understanding of what these formulas actually say and wish to convey.

Decree on Plenary Indulgences given by the Apostolic Penitentiary

Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful in the current pandemic, 23.10.2020

DECREE

This year, in the current circumstances due to the “Covid-19” pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with adaptation of works and conditions to guarantee the safety of the faithful.

This Apostolic Penitentiary has received many petitions from holy Pastors who have asked that this year, due to the “Covid-19” epidemic, pious works be commuted in order to obtain the Plenary Indulgences

applicable to souls in Purgatory, in accordance with the Manual of Indulgences (conc. 29, § 1). For this reason, the Apostolic Penitentiary, on the special mandate of His Holiness Pope Francis, willingly establishes and decides that this year, in order to avoid gatherings where they are forbidden:

a.- the Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally established only on the individual days from 1 to 8 November, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other;

b.- the Plenary Indulgence of 2 November, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the “Our Father” and the “Creed” there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful.

The elderly, the sick and all those who for serious reasons cannot leave their homes, for example because of restrictions imposed by the competent authority in this time of the pandemic, in order to prevent numerous faithful from crowding into the holy places, will be able to obtain the Plenary Indulgence as long as they join spiritually with all the other faithful, completely detached from sin and with the intention of complying as soon as possible with the three usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the Holy Father's intentions), before an image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary, recite pious prayers for the deceased, for example, Lauds and Vespers of the Office of the Dead, the Marian Rosary, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, other prayers for the deceased dearest to the faithful, or occupy themselves in considered reading of one of the Gospel passages proposed by the liturgy of the deceased, or perform a work of mercy by offering to God the sorrows and hardships of their own lives.

For an easier attainment of divine grace through pastoral charity, this Penitentiary earnestly prays that all priests with the appropriate faculties offer themselves with particular generosity to the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance and administer Holy Communion to the sick.

However, as far as the spiritual conditions for fully achieving the Indulgence are concerned, it is worth recalling the indications already issued in the “Note on the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the current pandemic” issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary on 19 March 2020.

Finally, since the souls in Purgatory are assisted by the prayers of the faithful and especially by the sacrifice of the Altar to God (cf. Conc. Tr. Sess. XXV, decr. *De Purgatorio*), all priests are strongly invited to celebrate Holy Mass three times on the day of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful, in accordance with the Apostolic Constitution “*Incruentum Altaris*”, issued by Pope Benedict XV, of venerable memory, on 10 August 1915.

This Decree is valid throughout the entire month of November, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.

Death and Funeral of Fr. A. J. C. Lawrence

Fr. Lawrence was staying with his younger sister's family at Reddichavady after retirement on 13-09-2020. On 12-10-2020 he found it difficult to breathe. So he was shifted from here in an ambulance to the Emmaus House, Colas Nagar. On the way he collapsed. Dr. Michael Anand after examining him declared that he died of Cardiac arrest. Then the Fathers of the Emmaus House offered the Mass for the eternal rest of Fr. A. J. C. Lawrence.

At 05.30 p.m. the body of Fr. Lawrence was brought to the Archbishop's House. Most Rev. Dr. Anandarayar blessed the body of Fr. Lawrence. His relatives and parishioners prayed around his body. On 13-10-2020 Fathers, Professors from St. Joseph's College, Cuddalore, Pope John Paul II College of Education, Reddiarpalayam and teachers from St. Paul's, Neyveli, St. Joseph's, Thirupapuliur, the parishioners of the Cathedral, Karaikal, St. Xavier's, Uppalam, Marakanam, St. Joseph's, Vinoba Nagar and Murungapakkam came and paid their respect and prayed for his eternal rest. Fr. A. J. Philomindoss, Director of the Pastoral centre was co-ordinating all this. At 11.00 A.m. Most Rev. Dr. A. Anandarayar blessed the body of Fr. A. J. C. Lawrence. Then the body was taken in procession through the corridor to the Cathedral. Our Archbishop offered the funeral Mass along with 40 Priests and 150 participants. In the introduction Fr. Alphonse Sandanam praised the good qualities of Fr. Lawrence such as his concern for brother Priests, jovial character and pastoral zeal and able administration in the field of education. In his homily Fr. R. Josephraj, talked about Fr. Lawrence as a great educationist, who was very efficient and kind and impartial in dealing with his students, staff and the parishioners. Even today, the seniority list prepared by Fr. Lawrence and updated by Fr. M. Swaminathan and Fr. R. Josephraj is being followed in the appointment of the teachers.

Archbishop thanked and praised Fr. Lawrence for his dedicated and committed service in the schools, colleges and parishes all these 44 years.

At the end of the Mass, the nephew of Fr. Lawrence, Deacon Bro. Derick Augustine (C.S.S.R.) thanked the Archbishop Most Rev. Dr. Anandarayar, and the 3 of his predecessors Most Rev. Dr. R. Ambrose, for whom Fr. Lawrence was an altar boy, Most Rev. Dr. V. S. Selvanather, who had ordained him and Most Rev. Dr. S. Michael Augustine, his uncle and Archbishop who had guided him. They had played a vital role in the life of his uncle Fr. A. J. C. Lawrence and he thanked the Procurator Fr. J. M. Gregory Louis Joseph and the Administration and all present. After the Mass the Archbishop blessed the body at the Cathedral and then at the graveyard. Then at 01.00 p.m. the body of Fr. A. J. C. Lawrence was laid to rest in the graveyard of the priests.

Death and Funeral Report of Fr. M. Jayaseelan

Fr. M. Jayaseelan had admitted his father Michael at the Government Hospital, Tiruvannamalai and given him treatment for Covid-19. Since Fr. Jayaseelan had been with his father he was also affected by Covid-19. In the meantime, Mr. Michael died of Covid-19 on 13-10-2020 at 10.00 p.m. Fr. Jayaseelan was admitted at the CMC, Vellore at 05.30 a.m. for Covid-19 on the same day. The

body of Mr. Michael was cremated and ashes were given and it was buried at Irudayampet on 14-10-2020 at 08.00 p.m. Fr. M. Jayaseelan who had been taking treatment for Covid-19 at CMC, from 13-10-2020 had mild heart attack on 23-10-2020. On examining him the doctors found that he had a block in the heart. They suggested Angio for him. But Angio could not be done, since all the organs has been affected. On 25th, they suggested Dialysis. On 26th the doctors said that Dialysis could not be done. Finally on 26-10-2020 at 05.35 a.m. Fr. M. Jayaseelan died of Covid-19. After, all the formalities, the body of Fr. Jayaseelan was handed over at 02.35 p.m. The body was brought in front of the Cathedral at 06.00 p.m. in the Ambulance. Since it was a death due to Covid-19, extra ordinary precautions were taken. A voluntary organization took charge of the body from the Ambulance to the graveyard. At 06.30 p.m. Our Archbishop Most Rev. Dr. A. Anandarayar did the final blessing of the body at the graveyard and Fr. M. Jayaseelan's body was laid to rest at 06.45. p.m., in the Priests' graveyard.

Requiem Mass for Fr. M. Jayaseelan

On 28-10-2020 at 11.00 a.m. Our Archbishop Most Rev. Dr. A. Anandarayar offered the Requiem Mass along with 25 Priests in concelebration at our Cathedral. Fr. Jayaseelan's Mother and 20 of his relatives attended this Mass. Fr. R. Josephraj in his

introduction said that Fr. Jayaseelan was calm and hardworking. His untimely death due to Covid-19 is a great loss to the Archdiocese and to his family. In his homily, his classmate Fr. S. Albert, praised Fr. Jayaseelan saying that he was a zealous priest and was easily approachable. Our Archbishop praised and thanked Fr. Jayaseelan's Mother and his siblings for having offered him for God's service in this Archdiocese. His Grace the Archbishop appreciated and thanked Fr. Jayaseelan for his dedicated priestly ministry as an Assistant at Nellithope, Karaikal and as the Parish Priest of Munnur, Indira Nagar, Kallery and Manalurpet and as Manager at the Neelaveli Estate. He added that while many Priests were not inclined to go to Neelaveli Estate, he readily accepted to be the Manager of it. Thus, his availability was great. He was a deeply spiritual person united with Christ. And His Grace exhorted all, to pray for him and for all the souls in purgatory in the Month of November. After the Mass, the Archbishop blessed the photo of Fr. Jayaseelan. Then at 12.10 Noon Fr. Jayaseelan's grave was blessed by the Archbishop.


